ACTION PLAN FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF FREEDOM OF INFORMATION LAWS IN THE CARIBBEAN

An important outcome of the **2013 Regional Conference on Freedom of Information in the Commonwealth Caribbean** was the creation of an **Action Plan** which prioritized actions to improve FOI in 11 Caribbean countries: Antigua and Barbuda, Bahamas, Belize, Cayman Islands, Grenada, Guyana, Jamaica, St. Lucia, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, and Trinidad and Tobago. Each of these countries are in varying stages of FOI implementation region. It is anticipated that participants in the countries can refer to these priority actions and work towards improving the status of FOI implementation in their own countries.
